MILZOL PLUS (Triple Action Cream)

1. What Milzol Plus cream are and what they are used for Clotrimazole, Betamethasone Dipropionate, Neomycin Sulfate Antifungal - Anti-inflammatory - Antibacterial Composition :

Clotrimazole USP 1.0% w/w

Betamethasone Dipropionate USP

equivalent to Betamethasone 0.05% w/w

Neomycin Sulphate USP 0.5% w/w

Chlorocresol USP (As preservative) 0.1% w/w Cream base q.s

Betamethasone belongs to a group of medicines called topical corticosteroids which are used on the surface of the skin to reduce the redness and itchiness caused by certain skin problems. Clotrimazole is a topical anti-fungal medicine used to treat some fungal





infections of the skin. Neomycin, an antibiotic, is used to prevent or treat skin infections caused by bacteria. It is not effective against fungal or viral infections.

MILZOL PLUS is indicated for topical use in the treatment of a wide range of eczemas and other inflammatory and allergic infections of the skin caused by various bacteria / fungi. This conditions include contact dermatitis, follicular dermatitis, impetigo, intertrigo, eczematoid dermatitis, non specific pruritus etc

2. Before you use Milzol Plus Cream

Do not use Milzol Plus Cream

- if you are allergic to betamethasone dipropionate, clotrimazole and neomycin sulphate or any of the other ingredients of this medicine (listed in section 6).
- if your skin becomes irritated, or you develop an allergic reaction.
- on any other skin infections as it could make them worse, especially rosacea (a skin condition affecting the face), acne, dermatitis (skin inflammation) around the mouth, nappy rash or other skin infections.

Warnings and precautions

If you have psoriasis, your doctor may want to review your treatment regularly. Contact your doctor if your psoriasis gets worse or you get raised bumps filled with pus under your skin.

Contact your doctor immediately if you, or your child, experience blurred vision or other visual disturbances.

Side effects that may happen with inhaled or oral corticosteroids may also occur with corticosteroids used on the skin, especially in infants and children.


If you use more than the correct amount of cream and/or use it for longer than is recommended, it can affect the levels of certain hormones in the body, particularly in infants and children.

In adults the changes in hormone levels may lead rarely to puffiness or rounding of the face, weakness, tiredness, and dizziness when standing or sitting down.

Children

Do not use this medicine on children under 12 years of age unless advised by your doctor. If you use more than the correct amount of cream and/or use it for longer than is recommended, it can affect your child's hormones. Rarely this may lead to:

• Delayed growth and development





- A moon face or rounding of the face
- A build-up of pressure around the brain which can produce
- a bulging of the fontanelle (the soft spot in the top of the skull) in infants
- a constant thumping headache
- blurred vision or other visual disturbances

Pregnancy and breast-feeding

If you are pregnant or breast-feeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have a baby, ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice before taking this medicine.

3. How to use Milzol Plus Cream

After cleaning the affected area, a sufficient quantity of MILZOL PLUS should be applied to the affected area to form a thin even layer, two or three times daily. This treatment should be continued for several days after the disappearance of symptoms.

4. Possible side effects

Skin atrophy or striae may occur following long term treatment with preparation containing corticosteroids.

5. How to store Milzol Plus Cream

Store in a cool place protect from light. Do not freeze.

For external use only.

Keep the tube tightly closed.

What Milzol plus Cream contains

The active substances are betamethasone dipropionate, Clotrimazole and Neomycin sulphate.


The other ingredients are:

Chlorocresol, Sodium Acid Phosphate ,Propylene Glycol ,Polysorbate-80,Paraffin Liquid light,Cetomacrogol-1000, Cetostearyl Alcohol
